- Ensures trauma resident documentation is complete and timely for trauma H&P's, daily notes, & discharges
- Notify trauma attending of all Trauma 97 patients within 1 hour of evaluation and prior to any patient discharge from the ED
- Notify trauma attending if any acute change in patient condition including ICU admissions, patient deaths,

### **Working With Teens Who Have Experienced Trauma**

Trauma Principles It is the child's experience of the event, not the event itself, that is traumatizing If we do not look for or acknowledge trauma in the lives of children and adolescents, we end up chasing behaviors and limiting the possibilities for change

### **SAMHSA's Working Definition of Recovery**

Recovery is supported by addressing trauma The experience of trauma (such as physical or sexual abuse, domestic violence, war, disaster, and others) is often a precursor to or associated with alcohol and drug use, mental health problems, and related issues Services and supports should be trauma-informed to foster

Helping Patients Cope With A Traumatic Event What Is a Traumatic Event? An event, or series of events, that causes moderate to severe stress reactions, is called a traumatic event Traumatic events are characterized by a sense of horror, helplessness, serious injury, or the threat of serious injury or death Traumatic events affect survivors
